has on any future roads. Mr. Edwards replied if a road was going to be taken by condemnation or restrictive easement as this one was it might affect how you define of public purpose. Judge Miller asked if the rule of thumb that has guided the county all of these years - that if we maintain a road for so many years, made improvements, etc. is out the window. Mr. Edwards replied no - that's only one part of it - it has to be for a public purpose or public need. This road was maintained by the county for years, but the jury decided that it served no public purpose. Following discussion about roads and steps for formal acceptance of roads that are in the county road system - such as Scottie Henson Lane - as well as other roads that have been in the system for many years that were not deeded to the county, no action was taken.

C. April of odd numbered years is the time that road name change requests are considered by the Court. One has been submitted to change CR 1045G Lookout Lane to Beshears Lane. The Fiscal Court Clerk was instructed to contact Mr. Beshears and have him submit a petition with the signatures of all of the property owners on the road with this request.

D. Judge Miller has spoken with Jailer Roger Ford about replacement of the control panel at the jail. It appears that KACo insurance will pay for part of the replacement cost and FEMA may pay a portion also.

IV. NEW BUSINESS:

A. County Clerk Dianne McKendree asked for the Court's consideration of purchasing workstations and cabinets for the vault at a cost of \$5,416.65. Judge Miller added that the Special Projects Crew could install the units. A motion was made by Com. English and seconded by Com. Gold to approve the purchase as requested. All voted aye. Motion carried.

B. The Marshall County Conservation District submitted the annual plan of work for FY 2009-2010. A motion was made by Com. Gold and seconded by Com. Anderson to accept the plan of work as submitted. All voted aye. Motion carried.

C. Judge Miller informed that he received an e-mail containing a brief synopsis of the new Kentucky Drug Free Workplace Certification Program. The 2007 session of the Kentucky General Assembly passed legislation allowing a 5% discount on Workers Compensation premiums to any employer who obtains certification as a Drug Free Workplace under the program that is administered by the Kentucky Department of Workers Claims.
