The A.D.A. came into effect in 1990 and the complex was built after that. Harold Fletcher, one of the architects/engineers on the complex informed that the A.D.A. was in effect but was not enforced when the complex was built. Robert Strow added that a portion of the A.D.A. requirements were cloudy concerning public access areas being handicapped accessible. Judge Miller answered that if someone in a wheelchair was hired at the complex, that needed to go in other areas that were not public access, in order to comply, the doors need to be widened and the bathrooms made handicapped accessible. Ms. Carter informed that Danny Nelson, who is a member of the A.D.A. Committee is working on the amounts per building it would take to bring the buildings into compliance. Judge Miller commended the Committee on a job well done. Ms. Carter informed that the Committee will provide further reports.

I. Lida Hill presented a letter to the Court. Judge Miller read it aloud. Mrs. Hill is opposed to using county tax money to build a park in the Buckhorn Bay area. She added that she felt that the park would probably benefit only a isolated group of people and that the money would be better spent on a county museum.

## IV. OLD BUSINESS:

- A. A motion was made by Com. Hargrove and seconded by Com. Hicks to approve the minutes of February 21, 1995. All voted aye. Motion carried.
- B. The members of the Court met last night with the Hardin City Council concerning the South Marshall Community Building. After hearing comments concerning the situation at Hardin, and after two motions were made, seconded and the motions and seconds both rescinded, a motion was made by Com. Hicks and seconded by Com. Hargrove to authorize the Hardin City Council to draw up guidelines for renting the South Marshall Community Building, and to submit the proposed guidelines for the Court's approval. All voted aye. Motion carried.
- C. Gary Atkins has inspected Eagle Lake Road and it meets all specifications to be accepted into the county road maintenance system. The road is 2,640 feet long, 18 feet wide and is located off of Hwy. 68, across from the Marshall County High School. A motion was made by Com. Hargrove and seconded by Com. English to accept Eagle Lake Road into the county road maintenance system. All voted aye. Motion carried.
- D. Following the first reading of Ordinance 95-03, regarding county road name change procedures, a motion was made by Com. Hargrove and seconded by Com. Hicks to approve the first reading of Ordinance 95-03. All voted aye. Motion carried.
