

\$12,163.71. Judge Miller added that this is a resource that we can't afford to lose. A motion was made by Com. Gold and seconded by Com. Anderson to participate in the Hazmat program and contribute \$12,163.71. All voted aye. Motion carried.

E. A motion was made by Com. Gold and seconded by Com. Anderson to go into executive session to discuss litigation. All voted aye. Motion carried.

F. Judge Miller called Court back into regular session and informed that the Court has been notified of intended litigation regarding a road. The information has been turned over to KACo's Attorneys.

G. Mr. Beshears was not present but submitted a copy of a petition asking that Lookout Lane be changed to Beshears Lane. Rick Leeper, who owns a house on the road, did not sign the petition. Since Mr. Beshears letter of 2007, the sign on the road was changed from Lookout Lane to Beshear Lane (then to Beshears Lane). The sign has now been changed back to Lookout Lane because after researching the court records, no official action was taken by the Court to change the road name. Following discussion, Judge Miller said he would tell the parties involved that they are welcome to come to the next Court meeting to state their concerns on the road name.

H. Judge Miller presented the contract for services from the Marshall County Health Department for the Marshall County Fiscal Court employees for Hepatitis B vaccine and Flu shots for FY 2010/11. A motion was made by Com. English and seconded by Com. Anderson to approve the contract as presented. All voted aye. Motion carried.

I. The next Kenlake-Aurora Economic Development meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, June 8<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 at Kenlake State Park Hotel.

J. A motion was made by Com. Anderson and seconded by Com. Gold to approve payment of the bills. All voted aye. Motion carried.

K. Com. English asked Gary Atkins about mowing on county road right-of-ways. The first round has been completed and the second round of mowing has started.

L. Judge Miller said he has been getting a lot of complaints on mosquitoes. The spraying plane which was used by the state Department of Agriculture has been sold and the office in Paducah has been closed. He added that he continues to stay in touch with Frankfort and the office at Gilbertsville and is hoping for grant funding to help with this situation.
