IN RECOGNITION OF NATIONAL PUBLIC SAFETY TELECOMMUNICATORS

- WHEREAS,** emergencies can occur at any time that require police, fire, or emergency medical services; and
- WHEREAS,** when an emergency occurs the prompt response of police officers, firefighters, and emergency medical personnel is critical to the protection of life and preservation of property; and
- WHEREAS,** the safety of our first responders is dependent upon the quality and accuracy of information obtained from citizens who call the Marshall County E911 Communications Center; and
- WHEREAS,** Public Safety Telecommunicators are the first and most critical contact our citizens have with emergency services, acting as the “first” first responders to emergencies as they occur; and
- WHEREAS,** Public Safety Telecommunicators are the single vital link for our police officers, firefighters, and paramedics by monitoring their activities by radio, providing them information, and insuring their safety; and
- WHEREAS,** Public Safety Telecommunicators of Marshall County, Kentucky have contributed substantially to the apprehension of criminals, suppression of fires, and treatment of patients; and
- WHEREAS,** each dispatcher has exhibited compassion, understanding, and professionalism while performing their job in the past year.
