ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE HARDIN-SOUTH MARSHALL FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT

Be it ordained by the Fiscal Court of the County of Marshall, Commonwealth of Kentucky, that a Petition was filed pursuant to KRS 65.182 proposing the establishment of a fire protection taxing district for the City of Hardin and South Marshall area; that the Petition contained the requirements set forth in KRS Chapter 65; that pursuant to KRS 65.182 a Public Hearing was conducted and on May 21, 2003, the Marshall County Fiscal Court approved the creation of the taxing district to provide services as described in the Plan of Service and to exercise the powers granted by the specific statutes that apply to the taxing district.

The Hardin-South Marshall Fire Protection District shall begin levying taxes in the described area on January 1, 2004, and the Marshall County Court Clerk shall add the levy to the tax bills of the described area upon final adoption of this ordinance and compliance of KRS Chapter 65.005.
