

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REGULATION OF ALCOHOL TO COMPLY WITH THE KENTUCKY SECOND CHANCE LAW, TO ALLOW FOR ENTERTAINMENT AND DESTINATION CENTER LICENSES, AND TO REGULATE THE SHIPMENT AND DELIVERY OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES IN THE CITY OF BENTON, KENTUCKY.* This ordinance is summarized as follows: An ordinance that restates, in full, the ABC ordinance of toliows: An ordinance that restates, in full, the ABC ordinance of the City of Benton, including all amendments since the passing of the original ABC Ordinance. This ordinance also amends the ABC ordinance to require that the denial of a license due to having a criminal conviction or penalization of a license for employing a convicted criminal must be based on a crime which was directly convicted criminal must be based on a crime which was directly related to the use of alcoholic beverages. The reason for the refusal or denial of any license shall be given to an applicant in writing. The ABC administrator is authorized to apply for an entertainment destination center license in the event the City Council passes an ordinance establishing an entertainment destination center. The ordinance is further amended to allow distillers, small farm wineries, and quota retail package license holders to deliver or ship directly to customers of legal drinking age, if requested in person by the purchaser. Distillers may ship no more than four and one-half (4 ½) liters per purchaser per day for sales prior to January 1, 2021, and up to nine (9) liters per purchaser per day on and after January 1, 2021. Distillers shal be allowed to ship souvenir packages pursuant to subscription of distillery-sponsored club programs, in quantities not to exceed a distillery-sponsored club programs, in quantities not to exceed an aggregate of nine (9) liters per calendar year. Small farm wineries may deliver or ship packages of wine to visitors of legal drinking age, in quantities not to exceed four (4) cases per purchaser per day, and may deliver or ship packages of wine at retail pursuant to subscription or small farm winery-sponsored club programs, in quantities not to exceed an aggregate of one (1) case per month per calendar year. Quota retail package licensees may deliver or ship alcoholic beverages in quantities not to exceed four and shift (4) liters of distilled activities of tor (4) or second four (4) or second four the second one-half (4 1/2) liters of distilled spirits and four (4) cases of wind purchaser per day for sales prior to January 1, 2021, and in titities not to exceed an aggregate of nine (9) liters of distilled quantities not to exceed an aggregate or nine (9) liters of distilled spirits and four (4) cases of wine per purchaser per day on and after January 1, 2021, and by subscription members or club program members, in quantities not to exceed an aggregate of nine (9) liters per calendar year for distilled spirits, and an aggregate of one (1) case of wine per month per calendar year. The enrollment and payment for any subscription or club programs must be made in person at the location of the licensee. Shipment of alcoholic houses are like the subscription in crubibilized.
