Special Called Meeting
October 19, 2021

The Marshall County Fiscal Court met for a Regular Meeting on Tuesday, October 19, 2021 at the Marshall County Courthouse, Benton, Kentucky. Elected Commissioners: Justin Lamb, Kevin Spraggs, Monti Collins, County Attorney Jason Darnall were present. Judge Neal presided.

Judge Neal called court to order at 9:37 A.M.

I. GUESTS

A. EMS Director Bryan Cutsinger presented the bid received from Select Tech for the ambulance remount. A motion was made by Com. Collins and seconded by Com. Lamb to accept the bid from Select Tech for \$102,700. All voted aye. Motion carried.

II. CORRESPONDENCE

A. Deputy Judge Brad Warning read the correspondence form the Office of the Governor regarding Southwest One.

B. Judge Neal presented the correspondence from Kentucky Fish & Wildlife regarding chronic wasting disease.

E. A motion was made by Com. Collins and seconded by Com. Lamb to approve the Fiscal year 2021 4th quarter amended treasurer's quarterly report. All voted aye. Motion carried.

F. A motion was made by Com. Collins and seconded by Com. Lamb to approve the transfers. All voted aye. Motion carried.


G. Judge Neal asked if there was any reason to deny current bills and claims. The bills and claims are to be paid.

H. County Attorney Jason Darnall updated the court on the status of the Sheriff's Department Retirement and stated that the County is not liable to pay it back.
